

Planting Zones: A hardiness zone is a geographically defined area where a specific plant is capable of growing as defined by climatic conditions, including its ability to withstand the minimum temperatures of the zone. Please note that all information is approximate and is based on the average minimum climatic conditions of each area. Each area may go through periods of extended weather fluctuations that may differ slightly from the information provided. If you are new to gardening or have recently moved to a new area, consult a professional garden shop in your area to compare the zones on this map to actual frost areas.

Lemon Grass						X	X	X	An edible that can be planted in pots in cooler zones and brought indoors for the winter. In zone 8, be sure to mulch well.
Leucojum		X	X	X	X	X	X	X	Easy to please leucojum provide cheery, fragrant spring blooms, naturalizing readily in most parts of the U.S.
Lilies	X	X	X	X	X	X	X		Stately, striking and rich with spicy scents, trumpet lilies grow across a wide variety of zones.
Lycoris				X	X	X	X	X	All these thrive in the warm zones 8 through 10. For zones 6-7, mulch is required.

Oxalis		X	X	X	X	X	X	X	Adenophylla; the only cold hardy Oxalis. The rest prefer zones 8-10. Grow indoors anywhere in good sunlight.
Oxblood Lilies					X	X	X	X	A solid zone 7-10 producer. Native to the south as it handles humidity well.
Paperwhites						X	X	X	Primarily grown indoors where zone information is irrelevant. Requires the warm weather of zones 8-10 outside.
Peonies	X	X	X	X	X				Garden royalty with big blooms, killer fragrance, & live 50+ years. Only able to grow and flower in cool climates.
Plumeria							X	X	Plumeria need lots of sun and warmth, but surprisingly little water. Rapidly draining soil is a must. Protect from frost.
Ranunculus						X	X	X	Ranunculus are hardy in 8-10 but can be grown as annuals (in spring) in cooler areas. Start before weather turns hot.
Saffron Crocus			X	X	X	X			Lots of sun, well-drained soil, a cold winter and a hot, dry summer dormancy yield the best results with saffron crocus.
Scilla		X	X	X	X	X	X	X	Heat and cold tolerance varies by cultivar; see individual listings.
Shallots	X	X	X	X	X	X	X	X	Shallots thrive in most zones in well-drained, nutritious soil. Apply thick winter mulch in zones colder than 6.
Siberian Iris	X	X	X	X	X	X	X	X	Happily adapting to most climates, Siberian Iris are not suited to hot, dry climates
Snowdrops	X	X	X	X	X	X	X	X	Snowdrops are very cold hardy (zone 3) and manage up to zone 9 heat; see individual listings.
Spanish Bluebells Hyacinthoides	X	X	X	X	X	X			Comfortably surviving very cold winters, Spanish Bluebells grow well as far south as zone 8.
Sparaxis						X	X	X	Sparaxis require warm settings; they are not winter hardy in areas colder than zone 8.
Squill Giant White						X	X	X	Giant White Squill survives in moderate zone 8; loves hot zones 9 and 10. Dry air is best.
Tritonia							X	X	A strickly warm climate bulb only. Well suited for containers as well as the garden.
Trout Lilies (Erythronium)	X	X	X	X	X	X	X	X	Can be grown from Canada down to the deep south. Fabulous hardy growers.
Tulips	X	X	X	X	X	X	X	X	Species tulips are very cold tolerant; they can also manage dry heat, as far south as zone 9. Check individual variety listings.
